

Should You Use Proprietary Legends?

It is common for technology-based businesses to put a proprietary legend on their documents and drawings to warn recipients that the contents may be protected. These legends typically include a warning that the contents may be confidential, as well as a purported restriction that the contents may not be reproduced, used, or disclosed to others without permission of the owner. The legend may include a claim of copyright in the materials, as well.

A PROPRIETARY LEGEND SHOULD IDEALLY BE CUSTOMIZED TO THE SPECIFIC CONTENT AND THE PARTICULAR APPLICATION. AN EXAMPLE OF A BROADLY APPLICABLE LEGEND FOR MOST DRAWINGS AND DOCUMENTS, HOWEVER, WOULD READ AS FOLLOWS: A proprietary legend should ideally be customized to the specific content and the particular application.
